About the Club

The AOMCC was formed at a meeting held on Saturday 24 November 1951, at the famous Ace Café on the North Circular Road in London, by a small group of enthusiasts from the London area. **Membership is open to all owners of, and enthusiasts for, Ariel motorcycles.** The AOMCC was one of the founding clubs of what later became the British Motorcyclists' Federation.

The club exists to provide opportunities for Ariel enthusiasts to meet other owners. There are branches throughout the UK, as well as 'social meets' and numerous overseas branches too. Being a branch member adds to the benefits of club membership but the unattached member is not forgotten. All full members receive the monthly magazine *Cheval de Fer*. This includes technical articles, members' news, branch reports and photographs. Members wishing to buy or sell spares may advertise free of charge and the magazine also carries trade advertisements relevant to Ariels. There's also a discussion forum run via our main website and a very active Facebook page.

The club also exists to advise members on matters concerning the running and maintenance of their machines, to encourage the production and availability of spares and generally to do its best to keep Ariels on the road. Spares organisers cater for the various models and can be relied upon to help with technical queries; help is also available on the Forum and Facebook group. The archives include some 2,000 works drawings and indexed technical articles from over 60 years back numbers of *Cheval de Fer*.

The club is a member of the Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs that protects the rights of users of all historic vehicles against the ever increasing threats of restrictive legislation.

There are many events held each year and, although vastly increased in size since its formation, the AOMCC remains an informal and friendly club. Subscriptions are kept as low as possible and all club officers are unpaid volunteers.

You will be taken to a website called GoCardless and prompted to fill in a form that authorises payment to the club. Before payment is taken an email will be sent warning you that payment is about to be taken and a second one letting you know that it has been successful.
